At the request of Chief and Council of Squiala First Nation, we have reviewed the Schedule of Remuneration and Expenses for Chief and Councillors of Squiala First Nation as prepared by management for the year ended March 31, 2017, presented pursuant to the funding agreement between Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada and Squiala First Nation. Our review was made in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagement and, accordingly, consisted primarily of enquiry, analytical procedures and discussion related to information supplied by us by Squiala First Nation.

A review does not constitute an audit and, consequently, we do not express an opinion on this Schedule of Remuneration and Expenses.

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that this Schedule of Remuneration and Expenses is not, in all material respects, in accordance with Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada Reporting Guide for First Nations, Tribal Councils and First Nation Political Organizations issued in December, 2015 and current for the 2017 fiscal year reporting.

This report is to be used solely to satisfy Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada funding requirements and should not be referred to or used for any other purposes.

Schedule of Remuneration and Expenses (Chiefs and Councillors)

**Name of Recipient: Squiala First Nation
For the Year Ended March 31, 2017**

1. The number of months during the fiscal year that the individual was a chief or councillor.

2. As per the First Nations Financial Transparency Act:

"remuneration" means any salaries, wages, commissions, bonuses, fees, honoraria and dividends and any other monetary benefits — other than the reimbursement of expenses — and non-monetary benefits.
